PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT APPROVAL TO OPERATE A PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

WHEREAS:

- A. Agricultural packaging products are prescribed products for the purposes of clause 46(a) of *The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010*.
- B. Pursuant to *The Agricultural Packaging Product Waste Stewardship Regulations* (the Regulations), no First Seller shall fail to operate a Product Stewardship Program approved by the Minister of Environment; or enter into an agreement with a person to operate, on the First Seller's behalf, a Product Stewardship Program approved by the Minister.

MINISTERIAL APPROVAL TO OPERATE is hereby given to CleanFARMS of Etobicoke, Ontario, hereinafter called the Applicant, who is hereby authorized to operate a Product Stewardship Program in the Province of Saskatchewan in accordance with the following conditions:

- 1. The Applicant shall operate the Product Stewardship Program (PSP) in accordance with the proposal dated December 21, 2017, titled Product Stewardship Program for Grain Bags.
- 2. The Applicant shall inform the Minister of Environment of any change in the design of the PSP from the proposal upon which this approval is granted and obtain prior approval for any such change.
- 3. Under the conditions set forth in Section 7 of *The Agricultural Packaging Product Waste Stewardship Regulations*, this approval may be cancelled at any time by the Minister of Environment if it is determined that the conditions of the Approval to Operate have not been properly followed.
- 4. The Applicant must develop a compliance plan and procedure jointly with the Ministry of Environment. The plan shall be in place within six months of launching the program in January 2018.

- 5. The Applicant shall submit their first annual report as outlined in the Regulation on or before June 30, 2019, describing the activities of the PSP as stated in Section 8 of the Regulations.
- 6. This Approval takes effect on the date of signing.
