

# Expanding ag waste recycling options for Saskatchewan farmers!











Saskatchewan agricultural producers can drop-off ag waste materials, free of charge at participating collection sites across the province.

 <p>Bags &amp; large tote bags</p>	<p><b>Seed, pesticide &amp; inoculant bags – Pilot Project</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>fold bulk bags and tie in bundles of six; place small bags in a collection bag provided free of charge through retailers at point of purchase</li> <li>excludes fertilizer and feed bags</li> </ul>	<p><b>Ag-retailers or seed dealers</b> May to October Contact your local retailer/dealer to confirm participation.</p>
 <p>Twine</p>	<p><b>Baler Twine – Pilot Project</b> <b>Silage Plastic &amp; Bale Wrap – Micro-pilot</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>place used twine in ag collection bags available for free at retailers; no netwrap please</li> <li>fold and secure large pieces of silage tarp with twine; place bale wrap in ag collection bags for 'pop-up' recycling collections</li> </ul> 	<p><b>Partner collection sites<sup>4</sup></b> Year-round</p>  <p>Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada    Agriculture et Agroalimentaire Canada</p> <p><small>This project is funded in part by the Government of Canada through Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's Canadian Agricultural Strategic Priorities Program (CASPP), a \$50.3 million, five-year investment to help the agricultural sector adapt and remain competitive.</small></p>
